* Family Traumas - Frederika's daughters (in Frederika's own words)

Both my daughters were born with severe heart defects. We found out about Charlie's (now 16 years old) at birth; Hannah's (now 14 years old) diagnosis came when I was 20 weeks pregnant. I was advised to consider a termination!

Hannah became ill with bronchiolitis when she was just 10 days old; she was in my arms when she stopped breathing, which resulted in her heart stopping, just as my midwife knocked on the door to do a routine check-up and was able to resuscitate her.

She then contracted the flu when she was just over 2 months old. She was in and out of hospital for much of her first year of life and had open heart surgery when she was just 10 months old (her surgery included the fitting of a bovine artery and valve to replace her missing pulmonary artery — she was part of a clinical trial and this procedure was a huge success).

She is a happy, affectionate and intelligent teenager with a lust for life, a sparky sense of humour and a delightfully irritating stubborn streak! She wants to become a paediatric cardio-thoracic surgeon when she grows up.

Charlie had open heart surgery when she was 5. She made a rapid recovery and was home within a week, only to be rushed back in as an emergency with post-surgery complications a few weeks later, but she overcame these with a maturity beyond her years, even then.

We always thought we had less to worry about with Charlie than Hannah, but on 3rd February 2010, we faced every parent's worst nightmare when we went to wake her up for school in the morning: Charlie had suffered a cardiac arrest. My husband administered CPR while I was on the phone to 999, with Hannah running between the 2 rooms, relaying instructions. Charlie received outstanding care at Doncaster Royal Infirmary and was then transferred to Leeds, where after 8 days of being kept unconscious in Intensive Care, she miraculously woke up with no long-term mental or physical damage. She was the first patient in Leeds (and one of the first few children/teenagers in the world, I believe) to be fitted with a Cameron Health Subcutaneous Defibrillator.

One of her first wishes on waking up from this experience was a pair of 'Irregular Choice' brand shoes! She now delights in telling people about the day she died' and continues to be witty, lively and delightful with all her little individual quirks. She is passionate about classical civilisations and wants to study History at Cambridge University, then go on to write novels and/or go into politics.
